
A Tie is an arched line connecting two timing elements that functions to add the time value of the note on the right to the note on the left. The note on the right of the tie is not played. This is useful for creating notes that need to ring outside of their measure or longer than 4 beats. It can also be used to facilitate easier reading of the timing, as in exercise 10.




